

## **MESF JOURNAL OF GEOSCIENCE AUTHOR'S GUIDELINES**

**Authors are required to check off their submission's compliance with all of the following items,**

**Manuscripts presented for publication should be typed in Microsoft Word and submitted to MESF Cyber Journal of Geoscience**

**Paper size should be (A4) with upper, lower and side margins of 1.5, 3 and 2.5 cm respectively. The writing should be (Times New Roman) for the English texts and should include the followings:**

- **Title in Arabic and English (letter size 14 Bold).**
- **Name of the author (or authors) in Arabic and English (letter size 12 Bold).**
- **Keywords (size 10), not more than 8 keywords, preferably not repeated from the title.**
- **Abstract in Arabic and English (should not exceed 500 words each).**
- **Affiliation, mailing address and e-mail of the author(s) should be given as foot note on the first page of the manuscript.**
- **The manuscript is expected to include: Introduction Methodology, Results, Discussion, Conclusions and References.**
- **References should be listed alphabetically and printed (font 10) at the end of the manuscript. All references in the list should be referred to in the text (and vice versa) using family name and date of publication. The following examples are for clarification:**

**Tables should be referred to in the text and placed after their first citation. The number and title of the table should be placed on the top.**

**Figures, drawings, maps and photographs are all referred to as Figures (abbreviated as Fig.). Figures should be cited in the text and must be clear, neat and do not exceed (15 × 25) cm in dimensions. Figure captions should be placed below the figures. Digitized figures are preferable, otherwise they should be scanned, not less than 500 Dpi.**

**Manuscripts presented to the Journal for publication are reviewed by referees. The manuscript is returned to the senior author with the referees comments and suggestions to be revised accordingly. The revised copy will be checked by editor to ensure that the revised copy is amended according to the remarks of the referees, otherwise it will be returned to the senior author.**

**When a manuscript is accepted for publication, the senior author will be informed by an official letter together with a copy of the accepted manuscript for proof reading.**

**The submission has not been previously published, nor is it before another journal for consideration**

**The submission file is in OpenOffice, Microsoft Word Format**

**The text is single-spaced; uses a 12-point font; employs italics, rather than underlining (except with URL addresses); and all illustrations, figures, and tables are placed within the text at the appropriate points, rather than at the end.**

As part of the efforts to be a member of the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE), the journal will follow the COPE guidelines on how to deal with potential acts of misconduct. The integrity and presentation of the research can be achieved by following the rules of good scientific practice, which include:

- The manuscript has not been submitted to more than one journal simultaneously.
- Permission to submit has been received explicitly from all co-authors and from the responsible authorities (inclusively or explicitly) at the institute/organization where the work has been carried out, before the work is submitted.

In case of suspicion of misconduct, the journal will carry out an investigation following the COPE guidelines. If, after investigation, the allegation seems to raise valid concerns, the accused author will be contacted and given an opportunity to address the issue.

Tables should be referred to in the text and placed after their first citation. The number and title of the table should be placed on the top. Scanned tables are not accepted.

Figures, drawings, maps and photographs are all referred to as Figures (abbreviated as Fig.). Figures should be cited in the text and must be clear, neat and do not exceed (15 × 25) cm in dimensions.

**Scientific notes should have the same formatting of research papers, but without abstract and the number of the pages should not exceed 5 pages. Scientific notes will be published in the first coming issue, after being reviewed by an editor.**

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
